Academic Search Premier: Provides coverage for social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, arts and literature, medical sciences, and ethnic studies. Citations and full text available. 1984-present. Updated monthly.

Humanities & Social Science Index: Provides coverage in literature, sociology, anthropology, geography, etc. 1983- present. Updated monthly.

MLA International Bibliography: A bibliography of journal articles, books and dissertations published by the Modern Language Association. World literature, folklore, music, art, rituals, and belief systems. Other topics include literary theory and criticism and the dramatic arts. Citation and fulltext available.

MAS Ultra: Full text for 550 magazines, 91,600 biographies and 75,000 primary source documents, and 250 reference books.

Oxford English Dictionary: The accepted authority on the evolution of the English language over the last millennium, a guide to the meaning, history, and pronunciation of over half a million words, both present and past.

Readers Guide to Periodical Literature: Subjects include popular literature, current events, business, fashion, politics, crafts, food, sports, history & science. 1983-current
