



## Courses Requiring Access to Children

Students **must** have a CRC Clearance Letter with NLC  
(see notes on second page)

### ECEC 100 Curriculum 1

- Requires access to a children's program that has a minimum of 6 children, a flexible, play based environment, where students can actively observe, facilitate play, assess children's curriculum needs and interests, and plan experiences to demonstrate course concepts.

### ECEC 200 Curriculum 2

- Requires access to a children's program that has a minimum of 6 children, a flexible, play based environment, where students can actively observe, facilitate play, assess children's curriculum needs and interests, and plan experiences to demonstrate course concepts.

### ECED 101 Principles and Practices

- No access to children required. An interview with two Early Childhood Educators is required. Please note that interaction with children or the opportunity to observe their play offers opportunities to apply theories or see them in action which will enhance learning, so although it is not required to complete the course work or assignments, it is always on asset.

### ECED 109A Practicum 1

### HDEC 103 Guiding and Caring

- Note: this is not a practicum; it is a course that requires practice in guidance strategies. Students are strongly encouraged to be in a practicum, employed, or volunteering 3 – 6 hours per week in an early childhood centre or school with children 30 months of age or older, as assignments require practicing guiding and caring skills within this age group. Students should discuss any concerns or special considerations with their instructor at the beginning of the course to discuss alternate arrangements.

Since January 2012, colleges in BC have been required by law to ensure that all students taking courses in the Early Childhood Education and Care program or in the Education Assistant program must complete a Ministry of Justice Schedule B Criminal Record Check.

**Under no circumstances are students permitted to complete any practical work without having a clearance letter on file with NLC's Registrar's Office. This means that students without the required clearance letter will not be able to complete a practicum or any courses where assignments require work with children or interviews with adults. Prolonged delays in completing a CRC may ultimately result in a requirement to withdraw from your course or program.**
