**\*\*Note for students applying to AHCOTE:**

SFU's Bachelor of General Studies (Education) requires the completion of Writing, Quantitative and Breadth requirements. All under-graduate students entering SFU are now required to complete at least 6 credits in courses designated Writing (W) and Quantitative (Q), and 18 credits in designated Breadth courses distributed among the Humanities (B-Hum), Social Sciences (B-Soc) and Sciences (B-Sci). Please ensure you are meeting these requirements when considering your electives by consulting [http://www.sfu.ca/uqcr/for\\_faculty/certified\\_wqb\\_courses.html](http://www.sfu.ca/uqcr/for_faculty/certified_wqb_courses.html).

**\*\*\*Note:**

After program admission, but upon registration in EDUC 252, students must complete a Criminal Record Check. Using the specified Consent Form, request a Ministry of Justice Schedule B Criminal Record Check (CRC). Because requests for Schedule B CRCs may take up to six weeks, students are strongly encouraged to attend to this post-admission requirement as soon as possible.

- \* **First Nations, History, and Women and Gender Studies:** It is the student's choice which category to assign these courses.
- \* **Human Geography:** *GEOG 101, GEOG 102, GEOG 103, and GEOG 240.*
- \* **Land:** *Land 227, Land 241, Land 245, Land 255, and Land 280.*
- \* **Physical Geography:** *GEOG 112, GEOG 114, GEOG 250, and GEOG 260.*
- \* **Math:** All NLC MATH courses are Science courses (although not lab science courses).
- \* **PHIL 110 (Introduction to logic and Critical Thinking)** course meets a quantitative requirement for some NLC certificates and diplomas.
- \* **SOWK 200 and SOWK 201:** These courses are considered 2<sup>nd</sup> year Arts courses.
- \* **Statistics:** *SOSC 207 and MATH 104* are Statistics courses.
