\* **Math:** All NLC MATH courses are Science courses (although not lab science courses).

\* **PHIL 110 (Introduction to logic and Critical Thinking)** course meets a quantitative requirement for some NLC certificates and diplomas.

\* **SOWK 200 and SOWK 201:** These courses are considered 2<sup>nd</sup> year Arts courses.

\* **Statistics:** *SOSC 207* and *MATH 104* are Statistics courses.
