Cultivate and engage donors.



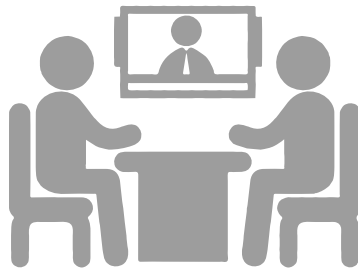
Broaden the scope of support for teaching and learning.
