


How to Respond to an Opioid Poisoning



Responsiveness means:

- Awake and alert **OR**
- Easy to wake up

Breathing normally means:

- Taking 12 or more breaths per minute **AND**
- No unusual breathing sounds (e.g. gurgling)

If at any time:

There is **NO PULSE**:

Start CPR with rescue breathing and compressions

They start breathing normally:

- Place them on their side
- Do not leave them alone
- Keep monitoring them
- Repeat SAVE ME if their breathing changes
- **STOP** giving naloxone when they are breathing normally – even if they are still unresponsive
