# NLC Foundation Gallops Ahead with 50/50 Success at Dawson Creek Fall Fair

For the second year, the Northern Lights College Foundation hosted its popular 50/50 draw and Mega Lottery at the Dawson Creek Exhibition and Stampede. The results were truly impressive. This year's total jackpot reached \$134,095, to be split evenly between the Foundation and the lucky winners.

The largest 50/50 prize was awarded on Saturday, with one fortunate ticket holder walking

away with \$19,165. The Mega Lottery winner on Sunday won \$20,997.

## **DCEA Barn Construction Project**






In December of 2024, NLC Trades students began lending their skills to a project that will serve Dawson Creek for generations: building new horse barns for the DC Exhibition Association. Rod Cork, Dean of Trades and Apprenticeship Programs, shared: "Building these

barns will create a legacy visible for years. They'll be used for rodeo and community events and provide emergency shelter for animals during evacuations. Our students can take pride knowing they've given back to the community."

## **Intercollegiate Rodeo**

#### **Birchcliff Donation**



Northern Lights College has upgraded our boiler lab thanks to Birchcliff Energy's donation of a steam separator and valve for our Fort St. John Campus, a project worth \$8,500.

This valve not only needed replacement, it is also integral as a teaching aid for our Field Operator Specialist-Hydrocarbon Resources (FOS-HR) and Power Engineering programs.

This contribution enabled us to replace and upgrade some key components of our steam turbine system, including piping, valves, and steam separation equipment. These improvements will significantly strengthen the quality of hands-on learning available to our students which will improve learning outcomes.


Josh Klassen explained the impact of donations like this for our students and programming.
