To offer you access to the best instructors and clinicians available, the Rodeo Team operates on a clinician-based coaching model.

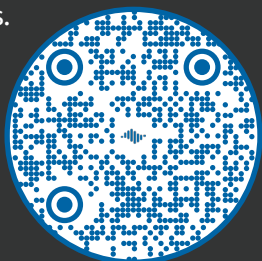

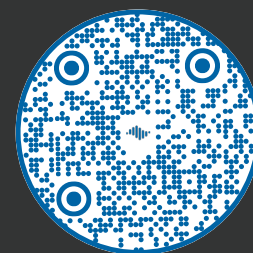

Team housing

For those interested in joining the Northern Lights College Rodeo Team, there is low-cost housing available on campus, or accommodations are available on our off-campus farm, located a few minutes from Dawson Creek, British Columbia. The Mile Zero farm house includes seven dorm-style rooms with common living area and kitchen (must be 19 years of age or older to live at the farm house). For the horses, there are 8 large outdoor pens with automatic waterers with option to rent additional space in a ten-stall indoor barn. The 119 x 215 outdoor riding arena was completed in the fall of 2021. There are many outbuildings on the property used for other storage.
