# 1. Election of Chair of Education Council Election of Vice-Chair of Education Council

#### 4. Action List Review

Policy Subcommittee – P. Nunoda noted with the change in Education Council membership he will now send out an email inviting people to join in the process.

CAAT Requirements – R. Tremblay reported he has had some discussion with Admissions Officers, M. Reitsma and J. LeClair. One thing is clear, that any changes to our present requirements will affect a number of students wanting to enter into the trades programs. He conveyed the need to move slowly and to proceed with caution. P. McClelland advised the next Academic Governance meeting had this topic on the agenda and she would forward this information on to R. Tremblay, J. LeClair and M. Reitsma after that meeting.

# 5. University Arts and Science Revised Course: BIOL 204 Introduction to Ecology

I. Mattson advised the BIOL 204 Introduction to Ecology course outline had not been updated since it was last taught in 2006. Revisions include reorganization and rewording of learning outcomes, expansion of course content and weighting. Course readings had also been updated to include a Canadian slant. S. Roe added the intent is to rearticulate the course to update the transfer capability.

# 6. Flexible Pre-Major Information

- S. Roe explained Flexible Pre-Majors are provincial agreements among post-secondary institutions that offer University Arts and Sciences programs. The purpose of these agreements is to identify a core set of lower-division courses that should be taken by students who are preparing to major in particular disciplines. Flexible Pre-Majors are not an actual credential and therefore do not require a Program Information and Completion Guide to be submitted. Presenting the concept of a Flexible Pre-Major on the Northern Lights College website will help students to become informed about this option and give them the opportunity to embed Flexible Pre-Major courses in an Associate of Arts Degree. Currently Northern Lights College is a signatory to the existing provincial agreements for Anthropology, English and Sociology however this information is not publicized on the College website.
- J. Bowman referred to the cover letter and inquired as to why the two instructors consulted, G. Lainsbury and H. Harper were not in favour of the concept. S. Roe indicated he was sure this was just a typographical error and should have indicated 'Yes' on the cover letter. J. Bowman asked that this be verified. S. Roe requested the item be approved subject to this verification.

Some concern was expressed surrounding the fact that without an actual block transfer agreement in place with other institutions there is no guarantee that students who participate in a Flexible Pre-Major will gain entrance into the institution of their choice. P. Nunoda wanted to get the grey area surrounding transferability of our programs on everyone's 'radar' and noted joint programs whereby students are registered at both the College and receiving institution would be a much bigger draw to students and these types of partnerships would offer a much greater guarantee. S. Roe concluded we can build positive gateways within these Flexible Pre-Majors.

13.04.03 M/S - BOWMAN/RASHID

THAT the Education Council approves of the concept of Flexible Pre-Majors for the University Arts and Science program as presented subject to verification that the two English Instructors consulted are both in favour of the Flexible Pre-Major concept.

D. Batterham explained that changes to the BC Articulation guidelines have necessitated changes to our Career and College Preparation Fundamental Math courses in order to keep them on the Provincial transfer grid. He noted some advantages in that the hours per each of the six courses are now uniform at 60 hours each. J. Bowman questioned some of the wording surrounding Math anxiety and the strategies to manage it and noted it was clearly stated in two of the outlines but not the others which might be confusing to students. D. Batterham acknowledged and clarified that the language used in the course outlines is straight from the articulation handbook and there is no flexibility in rewording it. Discussion followed as to how Math fundamentals and literacy are related.

## 13.04.04 M/S - McLEOD/LECLAIR

THAT the Education Council approves of the new courses; Math 011 Fundamental Math Level 1, MATH 012 Fundamental Math Level 2, MATH 013 Fundamental Math Level 3 as well as the revised courses; MATH 024 Fundamental Math Level 4, MATH 025 Fundamental Math Level 5 and MATH 026 Fundamental Math Level 6 for the College and Career Preparation program as presented.

# 8. Education Policy Honorary Associate of Arts Degree

A committee made up of Education Council members, spearheaded by the Registrar, will be responsible for perusing the nomination forms and making their recommendation to Education Council as to a likely candidate and suggested wording on the parchment.
