RELATED POLICIES:

POLICY

An Honour List is established by the College annually to recognize full-time learners for achievement of high standards of learning excellence.

PROCEDURE

The Honour List will be produced annually by the College. The list will be published in August to recognize achievements in the completed Academic year.

Inclusion on the Honour List demonstrates that a full-time student has achieved a high standard of learning excellence:

- 1. Grade Point Average of 3.67 (A-) or better in Academic programming; or 90% or better in Vocational programs.
- 2. Each learner receives a (form) letter from the Deans stating inclusion on the list.
- 3. Local newspapers in the College region are sent the Honour List for free publication.

SPECIFIC CREDIT PROGRAMS

Programs that have courses in which a Cumulative Grade Point Average can be determined. These programs have the following characteristics:

- 1. Consist of more than one semester of study.
- 2. Credit hours are specified for all courses.
- 3. Letter grades are used to record student achievement (A+, A, A-, B+, etc.).
- 4. Letter grades have assigned numerical weights (or grade points) which are used to determine the grade point average as specified in the College Calendar.
- 5. Grade Point Averages are determined each semester.
